Threats and Harassment in Local Government: Benchmarking Report

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Key Findings across <u>5 rounds of surveys to date:</u>

1. Increasing harassment for local officials, consistently high baseline across remaining categories

In the last three months, the rate of harassment of local officials has measurably increased. Incidence of insults, threats, and attacks have remained high.

2. Threats and attacks cut across party lines


While Democratic officials are more likely to report experiencing insults and harassment, the most serious events—threats of physical violence and actual physical attacks—are experienced at similar rates across parties.

3. Women and minority officials are harassed and threatened more often

Even after controlling for other factors like party and constituency size, women are significantly more likely to report being harassed, and both women and racial/ethnic minorities are significantly more likely to report being threatened.


Experiences of threats and harassment are widespread, with over a third of officials surveyed reporting harassment in a three-month period.

LIKELIHOOD OF EXPERIENCING EVENT IN A THREE-MONTH PERIOD




Threats and harassment of local officials remain consistently high.

% HAVING EXPERIENCED EVENT IN THE LAST THREE MONTHS




Local officials who are racial or ethnic minorities are disproportionately likely to experience insults, harassment and threats.





Local officials who are women are also more likely to experience insults, harassment, and threats.




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Insults, harassment, and threats are pervasive across communities of all sizes, but especially likely in bigger towns, cities, and counties.



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
Democrats are more likely to report insults and harassment, but all parties report experiencing threats in equal measure.

Liberals are more likely to be insulted but harassment and threats are experienced at similar levels across the ideological spectrum.




Insulted Harassed Threatened Attacked

% WORRIED ABOUT EVENT FOR THEMSELVES OR FAMILY MEMBERS



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While worry about being insulted, harassed or threatened has decreased slightly, worry about attacks remains consistent.

% WORRIED ABOUT EVENT FOR THEMSELVES OR FAMILY MEMBERS





Almost one-in-four minority officials worry about being physically attacked.




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Women officials report higher levels of worry about threats, harassment and attacks, reflecting disproportionate likelihood of incidents reported.




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Likewise, officials in the largest communities worry more than their counterparts in smaller communities.




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Worry for hostile events is high across the political spectrum.

- CivicPulse will continue to conduct quarterly surveys of local elected officials.
- Ongoing 1-on-1, confidential interviews will form the basis for additional insights, and follow up reports to BDI's <u>Initial Qualitative</u> <u>Report</u>.

Appendix – Methodology, Sample Characteristics, and Question Wording

- CivicPulse uses a comprehensive list of all elected policy makers associated with townships, municipalities and county governments in the United States with populations of 1,000 or more.
- CivicPulse recruits survey participants through an online randomsample approach.
- Elected policy makers include top elected officials (e.g., mayor, county executive) and governing board members (e.g., council member, county commissioner).

CivicPulse has conducted five national surveys of local elected officials.
